



(check all that you would attend)




2. Using a High/Medium/Low rating scale please rate the following professional development topics:

5. The previous question in reference to full inclusion.


**4. As a middle school science teacher who would you like to have at your professional development seminars?**




**5. Assuming the seminars were held during the preferred times indicated in question 1 would you attend these professional development seminars?**

100% of respondents said "Yes."


**6. Would you be willing to contribute to these professional development seminars (i.e. sharing lesson plans labs etc)?**



**7. Are you interested in becoming part of a committee to help design and organize professional development seminars?**




**8. How long have you been teaching?**
