This commitment has been demonstrated throughout Sandia's history and is an enduring part of our future. In addition to Sandia's corporate giving, our generous employees contribute funds, donate supplies, and volunteer at non-profits, academic events and in schools.

Sandia GIVES with corporate contributions and the annual employee giving program

Addressing our communities' greatest challenges

Sandia's Corporate Contributions program focuses on two critical areas - Educational Success and Family Stability. In 2023, National Technology and Engineering Solutions of Sandia contributed \$1.4 million on behalf of Sandia National Laboratories, to our local communities, including \$175,000 in the Livermore area.

Sandia awarded \$544,000 to 59 nonprofits in Family Stability and \$555,000 to 68 nonprofits in Educational Success in 2023. A complete list of grants awarded is located at the end of the report.



Sandia Gives Campaign

In 2023, the Sandia Gives annual employee giving campaign resulted in Sandians contributing \$4.4 million to support the non-profits that matter the most to them and to benefit programs run by the United Way of North Central New Mexico and the United Way Bay Area. In addition, Sandia contributed \$115,000 to the United Way of Central New Mexico Corporate Cornerstone Program and Donor Group Sponsorship and \$10,000 to the United Way Bay Area Spark program.



Sandia SERVES with volunteerism and donation drives

Through annual donation drives, employees give backpacks, shoes, books and school supplies to help students succeed in school. Sandians participate in volunteer projects throughout the year to sort and distribute food, harvest produce in urban gardens and improve living spaces.
