How to Search and Apply for Internships at Sandia National Laboratories


Are you interested in applying for a student internship at Sandia? Sandia has many available opportunities for students who are seeking year-round, co-op, or summer internships. We offer a wide variety of R&D, Technical, Business, Laborer and Clerical internships for students ranging from high school (ages 16+) to those pursuing an undergrad or graduate degree. Most internship positions will be available for students at the college undergraduate and graduate levels in R&D, Technical and Business disciplines. However, Sandia does offer internship opportunities for clerical and laborer students.

All internships are paid, and some may include relocation benefits based on eligibility requirements. Relocation benefits do not include housing stipends. Students must pay for their own housing during their internship. Sandia internships can be highly competitive, and it is recommended that students apply to multiple positions that are of interest to them for additional consideration.



How do I register to receive email notifications about current or future job postings?

- To register a new user account, go to http://www.sandia.gov/careers/search-openings.html
- To register, click on *New User* and complete your registration
- If you've already registered, click the *Sign In* button and enter your *Username* and *Password*. Filter by the Student Job Family or use keywords to search by specific postings
- Save your Search

Email notifications will be sent within 24 hours each time a new job is posted that meets your criteria.

How often does Sandia post internships and during what time of the year?

- Sandia posts year-round, co-op internships throughout the year
- Summer internships are generally posted between the months of August through mid-March
- All internship positions will be posted for a minimum of 7 days and new ones are posted frequently. Be sure to check the careers site weekly for new openings
- To be considered for an internship, students must apply online for each position individually. Ensure your resume is updated with your expected graduation date

What are the eligibility requirements for internships at Sandia?

- Students must be at least 16 years of age
- Enrolled full time at an accredited college, university, or local high school
 - Full time enrollment for undergraduate students is typically 12 credit hours and 9 credit hours for graduate students unless otherwise determined by their institution
 - Year-round/co-op interns must be enrolled full time during the academic year (spring, fall and winter)
 - \circ Summer interns must be enrolled full time during the spring term preceding the summer internship
- Minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA)
 - R&D, Technical, & Business interns applying for a high school, undergraduate or graduate internship must have a 3.0/4.0 GPA
 - \circ Clerical or Laborer interns must have a 2.5/4.0 GPA
- For R&D, Technical or Business internships students must be pursuing a degree in a related field of study
- U.S. citizenship for positions that require security clearances or as stated in the job posting
- Students must be officially accepted to their pursued degree program and be taking equivalentlevel coursework within the program to be eligible to apply for high school undergraduate or graduate positions.
 - What if I am in a dual BS/MS degree program? If you're in a dual degree BS/MS program and have met all requirements below, then you may be eligible for a graduate internship. If the following does not apply, then please apply to an undergraduate internship posting.
 - Officially accepted in graduate program (not just dual degree program)
 - Graduate program acceptance must specify spring prior to summer internship or earlier
 - Enrolled full time in graduate level course work for spring prior to summer internship; graduate course work taken prior to acceptance into graduate program does not count as being enrolled as graduate student.
 - What if I am in a HS/BS dual credit program? If you're enrolled in a HS/Dual Credit program and meet all requirements below, then you may be eligible for an

undergraduate internship. If the following does not apply, then please apply to a high school internship.

- Earned a high school diploma in the fall term preceding the summer
- Officially accepted into undergrad program (not just dual degree program)
- Enrolled full time in undergrad program for spring prior to summer
- Am I eligible for a graduate summer internship if I graduated in the spring semester with an undergrad degree?
 - No, students graduating in the spring must apply for an undergraduate internship for the summer. To be considered for a graduate internship, you must have earned your bachelor's degree in the fall and be accepted and enrolled full time in your graduate program in the spring preceding the summer internship.

How long is the hiring process?

- The hiring process for selected candidates can take up to six to eight weeks depending on various factors
- Selected applicants must also have a favorable pre-employment background review and drug screen results during this time

Do I need a security clearance for an internship?

• Many positions require a U.S. Department of Energy security clearance (based upon the work assignment) and will be identified within the job posting
