

# Building Equitable Community Partnerships

## ES4SE Technical Assistance Program Evaluation

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The U.S. Department of Energy's **Energy Storage for Social Equity (ES4SE)** Initiative is designed to help urban, rural, indigenous, and tribal disadvantaged communities address their energy system challenges by considering energy storage technologies and applications as a viable path forward. The two-pronged effort features a Technical Assistance (TA) Program and Project Development and Deployment Assistance (PDDA) Program.

### Community-Based TA

- Community needs inform the type of support and solutions
- Program elements designed or iterated collaboratively
- Implementation requires trusting relationships, flexibility, transparency, and responsiveness
- Challenges related to timelines, cultural competency, capacity declines, staff turnover, and changing priorities
- Program evaluation** is critical to assess goal attainment, provide accountability, and refine the engagement approach

### Evaluation Method

- Survey development
- Statement ranking (54 statements)
- Debriefing interviews (24 people)
- Factor analysis (3 factors)
- Interview analysis
- Narrative explanation

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Relationship and process oriented</li> <li>Valued flexibility and holistic support to understand community and needs</li> <li>Perceived lack of organizational resources or expertise and requested baseline education</li> <li>Desired collaborative project design, without a specific pathway being imposed</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Efficiency and outcome oriented</li> <li>Valued streamlined structure to focus on technical discussions and pathways</li> <li>Predefined set of goals and expectations for matching provider and community expertise</li> <li>Desired information and resources to meet immediate and specific needs</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Authority and outcome oriented</li> <li>Valued opportunity to leverage institutional knowledge and authority to direct change</li> <li>Perceived challenges and needs as hyper specific to community context</li> <li>Desired clarity on local political and economic systems impacting future pathways</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Introduce provider capabilities and roles</li> <li>Communicate data needed from community</li> <li>Assign one non-technical point of contact</li> <li>Understand existing community partnerships</li> <li>Include site visits during project scoping and feasibility assessment</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Offer distinct project phases and tracks</li> <li>Provide baseline information and education upfront</li> <li>Adjust meeting platform, content, and cadence to meet individual community needs</li> <li>Identify compensation mechanisms for mutually beneficial work (e.g., travel, speaking, and internships)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Identify mechanisms to continue engagement beyond TA, such as community-to-community consulting</li> <li>Collaborate on and co-author program deliverables</li> <li>Provide user guides and resource documentation to ensure knowledge maintenance and transfer</li> <li>Outline roadmap of next steps beyond TA</li> </ul>
