	- repairs				
	- other activities not related to select agents or toxins only when continuously escorted by an approved individual				
CFR: Section 11(d)(3)	Provide for the control of select agents and toxins by requiring security (e.g. card access system, lockboxes, etc.) against unauthorized access to: <i>[Specify in Comments]</i>

CFR: Section 11(d) (7)(iv)	Any release of a select agent or toxin				
CFR: Section 11(d) (7)(v)	Any sign that inventory or use records for select agents or toxins have been altered or otherwise compromised				
CFR: Section 11(d) (8)	Separate areas where select agents and toxins are stored or used from the public areas of the building.
